- Bachelor's degree in any field; but a degree in outdoor recreation, education, or related field is a plus
- Knowledge of outdoor education, experiential education, environmental education, & challenge course facilitation
- Wilderness First Aid or Responder, Lifeguard, American Canoe Association, Certified Interpretive Guide, archery, rock climbing, equestrian, or other certifications

Primary Responsibilities: Program facilitation for Outdoor Education groups, Specialty/Volunteer Weekends, and Afterschool Programs encompass about 60-70% of the workload.

- Serving as group leader and facilitator for Camp Ondessonk's outdoor education and afterschool programs for youth ages 6-14. Programs include:
 - Teambuilding, low and high challenge course activities, guided interpretive hikes, outdoor living skills, boating, campfires, astronomy, and more.
- Assisting in the facilitation of Specialty Weekends including Mother/Daughter, Family Camp, Father/Son, etc.
